juried exhibition

The Festival is known worldwide for a comprehensive collection of international fine art celebrating the diversity of human sexual expression. The incredible creativity with which artists approach the subject of erotica is captured in all manner of visual media: painting, photography, sculpture, assemblage, prints, mixed media, and more.

We are proud to present a world-class visual art exhibition showcasing art that is rarely seen in mainstream galleries, that goes beyond tired cliches of "sexiness," and redefines boundaries in exciting new ways.

jury process

Each year we invite an entirely new jury to select the visual art. This year, artist and Art Department Chair of Cornish College Bonnie Biggs, art historian and expert Dr. Gene Burt, sex positive activist and Deputy Director of Gay City Peter Jabin, artist and art collector Steve Jensen, and artist and Festival committee member Nina Ruchirat, reviewed nearly 2,000 entries submitted by 520 artists originating from 40 states and 25 countries—more than ever before.

David Crellin (aka Armitage Shanks) has a colorful history of experience, having worked as a circus performer, singer, director, actor, writer, musician, teacher and stuntman in a career spanning 30 years.

He was the co-founder and ringmaster of Circus Contraption, a Seattle-based, one-ring, traveling circus. Directing and co-writing credits include *Squirm Burpee—A Vaudevillian Melodrama*, which premiered at the New Victory Theater in New York City's Times Square; *A Trip to Coney Island with Zero Boy*; *Viva Oz Vegas*, starring El Vez; *Up, with a Twist* for the School of Acrobatics and New Circus Arts (SANCA); and *The Breaking*, starring the Can Can Castaways.

He also just had a starring role in the upcoming feature film *The Burlesque Assassins*.

Ambient Performances directed by Eva Luna

Eva Luna is a director and performer of peripheral based performance art. She has been both performing and directing with the Festival since 2009, creating "ground level" performances that sometimes bite!

Eva is a graduate of the American Academy of Dramatic Arts. Her performance experience has ranged from improv to classical theatre to abstract modern movement and dance. In 2006 she began performing at Little Red Studio, where she found a heightened awareness for erotic context in her art. Eva considers herself an underground artist. Working on Burning Man installation art since 2007, she places importance on strengthening relationships that build over projects and making "real" and honest connections with the audience while performing.

Eva is also a board member of Ignition Northwest, a local nonprofit art association.


